Peru consists of three distinct regions: the coastal desert strip, the snow-capped Andean mountains at the heart of the ancient Inca civilisation, and in stark contrast, the green, humid eastern slopes that descend into the lush tropical plains of the Amazon basin.

Culture

Bustling markets abound, where locals dressed in traditional clothing sell their produce and colourful hand-woven articles, carrying on an ancient weaving tradition.

Fauna and Flora

Each region boasts delights for the traveller, from the Ballestas Islands in the Pacific, to the



Andes, where condors soar above, and on to the dense, impenetrable Amazon rainforest with a dense tree canopy and giant bromeliads that can take a century to flower.

History

The land of the Incas, famed for its magnificent Machu Picchu, is a living testament to the once great empire whose golden treasures continue to be unearthed each day. One can see ancient ruins

shrouded in mist and mystery dotted throughout the country, whilst on the coast unknown peoples have etched large images and mysterious lines in the desert which can only be fully appreciated from the air.

Elsewhere, Inca foundations blend with stunning colonial mansions and many churches show a fascinating mix of pagan and Christian beliefs.

Lima, 'The City of Kings' was the administrative centre of the Spanish Empire in South America, and retains its historic Colonial architecture. The bustling, modern area of Miraflores is filled with shops, hotels and world-class restaurants offering a variety of innovative fusion cuisines. The city is home to the ruins of Huaca Pucllana, a pre-Inca pyramid, as well as museums exhibiting artefacts from over 2000 years of Peruvian civilisation.





Day 1 Early morning drive to Ica and continue to Nazca for your flight over the legendary Nazca Lines, an unexplained, intricate collection of immense drawings in the desert. Return to Ica for the night.
Day 2 An early start to drive to Paracas to take a boat out to the Ballestas Islands, a hive of bird and sea lion activity. Return to Lima, stopping en route for lunch.

3 days • 2 nights

Day 1 Depart from Lima on a coastal drive to Paracas, stopping at a vantage point or 'mirador' to view the sea lions. Overnight in Paracas.
Day 2 A morning boat trip out from Paracas to the Ballestas Islands, which swarm with a variety of seabirds and sea lions playing. Continue on to the oasis at Ica and then to Nazca for 1 night.
Day 3 Early morning flight over the spectacular Nazca Lines before returning to Lima.

ANCIENT PERU



The essential tour of Peru, steeped in ancient history and culture. Our journey leads us to the Lost City of the Incas, high in the lush sub-tropical Andean mountains, where imposing ruins occupy seemingly impregnable positions on craggy outcrops.

We sail the highest navigable lake in the world, where rafts and houses are still built out of lake reeds, and gain an insight into the mysteries that still envelop this land.

Day 1 Depart on Sunday on the direct flight to Lima, arriving in the evening. Transfer to the hotel, staying one night. (B)

Days 2-3 Fly to Juliaca, and transfer to Puno, on the shore of Lake Titicaca, where we stay for two nights. We take a boat out to the floating Uros Islands, where the locals have constructed their islands, houses and rafts entirely of reeds growing in the area. Continue by boat to rocky Taquile Island, to see the locals' colourful costumes and admire the spectacular scenery. (B)

Days 4-6 Full day train journey to

Cusco, aboard the Andean Explorer train. A beautiful journey, passing towering Andean mountains, hot springs, and remote villages. Lunch is served onboard as you watch the mountain scenery go by. On arrival at Cusco railway station we transfer to the Urubamba Valley for 3 nights. We spend 2 full days in the Sacred Valley of the Incas. On Day 5, we visit Pisac & Chinchero markets, Maras, the Inca village of Ollantaytambo and Pisac ruins. Day 6 free to explore. (B,L)

Day 7 Transfer to the railway station to board the Vistadome train. A trip

affording stunning views of the countryside and culminating in the majestic Machu Picchu. Our local guide leads us around this incredible site, the citadel of the Incas which was so well hidden that the Spanish did not find it. Clouds of mist shroud the tips of the surrounding mountains, and far below the Urubamba River threads its way on into the jungle. Overnight in a hotel nearby. (B,L)

Days 8-10 Morning free to explore Machu Picchu further, and return by train to Cusco, staying for 3 nights. Morning at leisure in this fascinating city, once the capital of the Incas before the conquistadors pillaged its treasures. Solid Inca foundations still remain, supporting ornate churches and buildings. Our local guide will take us round the attractive historical centre and on to the ruins surrounding Cusco, including the massive Inca fortress of Sacsayhuamán. Following day is at leisure to explore the city and soak up the unique atmosphere. (B)

Amazon Rainforest, Days 12-13



Our tour covers areas that embrace wildly differing landscapes - coastal desert regions interspersed with fertile valleys, the lush soaring mountain peaks where the Lost City of the Incas lay hidden for so long, and deep jungle boasting the rare giant otter, caiman and many species endemic to Peru.

Days 1-2 Depart on the direct flight to Lima on Wednesday or Friday, arriving the same day. Transfer to our hotel. The next morning travel south through coastal desert to Ica for 1 night. Take a flight over the legendary Nasca Lines. (B)

Day 3 Continue to the Paracas Peninsula for a boat out to the Ballestas Islands, home to sea lion colonies and thousands of marine birds. Lunch at Paracas and return to Lima for a night. (B)

Day 4 Today we fly south to Arequipa, situated in a beautiful valley at the foot of the snow-capped Misti Volcano. An afternoon excursion to explore this city, built almost exclusively



out of white volcanic stone. We will also visit the remarkable Santa Catalina Convent. Overnight at our hotel. (B)

Ica - Nazca, Days 2-3



Day 5 Fly to Juliaca and transfer to our hotel in Puno, a town on the shores of Lake Titicaca. From here we take a boat trip to visit the people living on the floating Uros Islands. (B)

Day 6 Continue on the full day Andean Explorer train on an unforgettable journey to Cusco, travelling across the Andean altiplano, past striking mountain scenery, small villages, remote farms and stations. Transfer to our hotel. (B,L)

Day 7 A full day excursion to the Sacred Valley of the Incas. The road winds down into the stunning Urubamba valley, where we visit Pisac market, the Inca village of Ollantaytambo and Pisac ruins. Return to Cusco. (B,L)

Days 8-9 Spend the afternoon on a tour of the city and the main ruins in the surrounding area, including the vast site of Sacsayhuamán. The next day is free for you to explore at leisure. (B)

Days 10-11 Leave Cusco by train following the Urubamba River, through beautiful countryside and culminating in the awesome Machu Picchu. After a guided tour you are free to explore the site. Overnight near Machu Picchu, returning to Cusco the following day. (B)

Days 12-13 Fly to Puerto Maldonado and travel by motorised dugout canoe up the Tambopata River to our jungle lodge. The next day we start early on a programme of daily excursions visiting at the macaw clay-lick, canoe on the nearby lake, hike in the dense tree canopy. We climb up a tower into the

The next day we tour the city, visiting the grand colonial squares, and the Larco Herrera Museum, housing a fascinating collection of pre-Colombian gold, silver and mummies. INCA TRAIL TO MACHU PICCHU

Rambling in the stunning Andean countryside, we follow Inca footsteps to explore the delights of Peru's mountain landscapes, culture, and colonial heritage, passing remote villages and ancient quinoa terraces. We use a support vehicle for luggage, local hotels as a base for our daily treks, and camp for three nights on the Inca Trail, accompanied by porters and cooks. This allows us to enjoy the beauty of this land.

Machu Picchu



Days 1-2 Depart on the direct flight on Sunday for Lima, arriving in the evening and staying for 2 nights. Tour the grand colonial squares, the bohemian Barranco area and the Larco Museum. (B)

Day 3 Fly to Arequipa, built from white volcanic rock at the foot of a towering snow-capped volcano. Afternoon visit of the city Cathedral and Santa Catalina Convent. (B)

Days 4-5 Scenic drive to the Colca Canyon, passing majestic volcanoes and the stunning mountain landscapes on a desert plateaux. We drive to the Cruz del Condor and walk along the top of the canyon, condors soaring above. Next day we walk past the extensive Inca terracing and through the villages of Chivay, Yanque and Maca, where local ladies still dress in their traditional embroidered dresses and hats. Return to Arequipa for one night. (B,L)

Day 6 Morning flight to Juliaca and from there transfer to Puno on the shores of Lake Titicaca. Afternoon boat trip to visit the Uros Islands made of reeds. (B)

Days 7-9 Full day journey on the Andean Explorer train, high across the Andean mountains to Cusco. Sit by the window and have lunch as the landscape unfolds. On arrival transfer to the 'Sacred Valley of the Incas' for three nights and two days to explore. Full day tour to Chinchero, visiting the market, past the salt mines of Maras and down to the Urubamba river for lunch. Visit the Inca village and ruins of Ollantaytambo, and Pisac ruins for sunset. (B)

Days 10-12 Transfer to the start of a three day trek on the ancient Inca Trail through cloud forests and jungle, past old Inca ruins and running streams, both up and down imposing valleys, before, on the morning of the fourth day, arriving at the awe inspiring sanctuary of Machu Picchu itself for a tour of the site. We spend three nights camping, with all meals, guide, equipment and porters provided. (B,L,D)



Until the arrival of the Spaniards in 1532, Cusco was the centre of the Inca Empire and is the oldest continuously inhabited city on the continent, whose legacy as the hub of the empire is readily apparent. 



THE SACRED VALLEY OF THE INCAS

Sacred Valley Excursion

Early start from your hotel for a long day starting with the colourful and authentic market of Chinchero where people from the surrounding communities congregate to trade their goods, mostly agricultural produce, not only trading in money, but also barter. The day continues to Maras pre-Inca salt pans and we walk down the ravine to the Urubamba River for lunch by the river. The car drives round while you walk to meet you at the restaurant; or you can stay in the car if you prefer not to walk. We then visit the fortress of Ollantaytambo, the archaeological complex believed to have been a gigantic agricultural, administrative, social, religious and military centre. Late in the afternoon we reach Pisac, a small colonial village built by Viceroy Francisco de Toledo where there is a tourist market with weavings and handicrafts. We drive up the mountain above the town to visit Pisac ruins, affording superb views of the surrounding countryside and sunset. Evening return to the hotel. (L)

The Urubamba Valley, known as The Sacred Valley of the Incas, was at the heart of their empire. Surrounded by a dramatic landscape of steep mountains and snow covered peaks, it is located east of the Inca capital of Cusco and leading to the citadel of Machu Picchu. Since ancient times, the fertile lands, ancient terraces and the waters of the Urubamba river have been used to grow the staple diet of Quinoa, potatoes, cereals and to breed livestock. The people still speak the native Quechua language and conserve ancient customs and ancestral rites.

Willoq & Patacancha Excursion

A visit to the village of Willoq, high in the Patacancha Valley, is a journey into the past, a visit to the descendants of the Incas. According to historians, the people of Willoq with their traditional red ponchos and shawls are the direct descendants of the last rulers of imperial Cusco, and remain today one of the Andean communities least affected by Western influence. The Willoq community is also well known for its weavers and the quality of the textiles; still a product of patience, knowledge and the skilled weaver. The primitive back-strap loom, unaltered for centuries, is still used to weave even the finest textiles. (L)

Pumamarca Hike Excursion

We start in Ollantaytambo walking slowly uphill to the quarry of Kachiqhata. Gigantic stones of pink granite were partially shaped in the quarry and then slid down the hill, before being dragged across the river and over the fields. Once across the field, the stones were dragged up a 1,200 ft ramp to the Sun Temple site at Ollantaytambo. Along the route we will admire the magnificent landscape of the Urubamba Valley below. We will see many enormous unfinished stones from the quarry, left behind in the fields, before returning along the trail back down to the valley. (L)



Horseriding Excursion

Horse riding is an excellent way to explore the countryside and the Quechua communities of the Urubamba valley, while becoming familiar with the Peruvian Paso horses. The Paso horse is a symbol of Peruvian tradition. We will ride using the original Peruvian Paso riding gear - handmade saddles and tack while dressed in poncho and sombrero.



Tambopata Research Center was built for tourism, research purposes and to protect the nearby macaw clay-lick, currently the world's largest, featured in National Geographic Magazine. Here, deep in the 700,000 hectares of the reserve, several species of macaws and parrots congregate to lick the minerals off a 500m long cliffside on the Tambopata riverbank.

The forest surrounding the centre has three types of terraced floodplain, terra firma, bamboo forest and palm swamps. There are 25 kilometres of trails under the dense canopy of primary rainforest in

unique flora and fauna. Return for dinner and presentation of the ongoing research projects before leaving on a night walk.

Day 3 An early visit to the world's largest macaw clay-lick, a flurry of activity as 15 varieties of macaw and parrot congregate. Return for breakfast, and set off on the celot Trail through primary rainforest of towering, 400 year old trees. Afternoon trip in a hand paddled canoe along the narrowest of waterways, a silent and effective method of observing the fauna. Return for dinner before setting off on a Frog-spotting Trail.

Day 6 In the morning we hike along trails, learning about the medicinal use of plants and looking for the famous Poison Dart frog. The hanging bridges walkway

Learn about the ancient cultures and beliefs of the Amazonian peoples in a recreation of a Shamanic Ceremony. Evening tour to see sunset over the Amazon and listen to the nighttime chorus of wildlife and insects, looking for caimans, tarantulas, snakes and anakondas. (B,L,D)

Day 7 Canoe trip along the tributary Yanayaquillo River into **Pacaya Samiria Reserve** to look for wildlife including toucans and macaws. Afternoon visit to a local Amazon village to learn about the native culture of the forest. (B,L,D)

Day 8 Disembark and transfer to the airport in Iquitos for the flight back to Lima. Connect with a flight to Cusco, and transfer to the hotel in the Urubamba Valley, staying for three nights. (B)

Guided tour of Machu Picchu, Day 11

Days 9-10 Two days of excursions in the Sacred Valley of the Incas, visiting the Inca village of Ollantaytambo with its hillside fortress, Pisac ruins and the colourful market where local farmers trade their produce and shops offer local weavings in soft alpaca wool. Next day visit the local market and weavers collective at Chinchero, the concentric circular Inca crop laboratory at Moray and the ancient salt pans at Maras, with a leisurely walk down into the valley. Lunch and afternoon to explore. Overnight at a hotel in town. Morning free to explore the town. Return on the Vistadome train to Cusco, staying for 3 nights. (B)

Days 13-14 Cusco was the hub of the Inca Empire, and the streets are still lined with Inca-built stone walls and many people maintain their Quechua-speaking culture. Visit the Spanish-era Cathedral, the main square (Plaza de Armas), and Qorikancha (Temple of the Sun), and Inca temple upon which Spanish church was later built. Continue to the nearby Inca fortress of Sacsayhuamán, where huge pieces of stone fit together with such precision that no cement is required. (B)

Day 15 Afternoon flight to Lima connecting with your return flight home, arriving on Day 16. (B)
